

# GREATER MIAMI AND THE BEACHES OPEN FOR BUSINESS



## HOTELS

- Staff must wear facial coverings when in interior and exterior common areas. Guests must do so when in interior common areas, and when social distancing cannot be achieved in outdoor common areas.
- Social gatherings and events limited to 10 or fewer people; convention and meeting spaces open to 50% capacity and must follow social distancing guidelines.
- Meetings and banquet arrangements set-up, including weddings, must be limited to no more than 50 percent of room occupancy.
- Pets not allowed in guest rooms, other than ADA service animals.
- Valet parking not allowed where onsite parking is available.
- Hotel pools: Face coverings are not required while in the water; face coverings are to be worn on deck areas in situations where social distancing is not possible.
- Masks must be worn, and 6 feet social distancing maintained while inside gyms and wellness facilities (except when engaged in high-intensity workouts with 10 feet social distancing).



## BEACHES

- Public beaches are open.
- Facial coverings must be worn when social distancing of 6 feet cannot be achieved, except for members of the same household, and in public restrooms and at concessions.
- Facial coverings not necessary when swimming or engaging in strenuous exercise.
- Gatherings limited to 10 or fewer people.
- Following are not allowed at the beach: canopies, tents, shared equipment (beach chairs, umbrellas, coolers, etc.) from different households, use of exercise equipment or playgrounds, special events, group picnics, organized athletics, or group activities.
- Fishing only in designated areas and while following social distance guidelines.



## RESTAURANTS, CLUBS & BARS

- Customers must always wear facial coverings, except when seated at a table.
- Indoor dining rooms open at 50% capacity, or up to 100% capacity with six feet of distance between tables.
- Outdoor dining permitted at full capacity.
- Restaurants can open for in-person dining from 6 a.m. to midnight.
- Call restaurants for hours of operation and takeout/delivery hours.
- Bars that offer counter service only open at 50% capacity, with seating separated as far as possible.
- Clubs with dancing must require masks be worn on the dance floor.
- Eating and drinking confined to tables only.



## MEETING & CONVENTION SPACES

- Facilities open at 50% capacity.
- Indoor food & beverage consumption and live performances allowed, with restrictions.
- Events can last up to six consecutive hours, with volume levels up to 90 decibels.
- Event organizers to establish attendee rosters for contact tracing.
- High-efficiency air filters must be installed.
- Meeting planners to establish a "Hygiene/Enforcement-compliance Ambassador."



## PARKS & OUTDOOR ATTRACTIONS

- Normal park operating hours are in effect. Check your local park for hours.
- Health and Wellness outdoor activities are permitted; playgrounds and sports fitness courts are open for use with social distancing in place.
- Gatherings limited to 10 or fewer people.
- Facial coverings must be worn except when stationary, while playing an organized sport or engaging in strenuous physical activity (must maintain 6-10 feet social distancing).
- Facial coverings must be worn when on the sidelines of athletic fields and courts.
- Children 2 years old and under do not have to wear a facial covering.
- Picnic shelters and water fountains remain closed.
- Dog parks and designated dog beach areas are open.
- Restrooms open with attendants to monitor use.



## ENTERTAINMENT VENUES, INDOOR ATTRACTIONS & MUSEUMS

- Movie theaters, concert houses, auditoriums, playhouses, bowling alleys, arcades, museums, and indoor amusement facilities open at 30-50% capacity.
- Indoor food & beverage consumption and live performances allowed, with restrictions.
- Facial coverings must be worn upon entering but can be removed while eating and drinking.
- Casinos open, with limited capacity. Food & beverages in designated areas only.



## MALLS & RETAIL SHOPS

- Retail shops open for business at 50% capacity.
- Facial coverings must be worn.
- Entry and exit points are indicated by markers creating one-way circulation paths inside stores.
- Most customer fitting rooms remain closed.
- Checkout queues are spaced out with floor markers (every six feet).

PARTNERS IN HOSPITALITY

A countywide curfew is in place between midnight and 6 a.m. Masks/facial coverings are required if you are indoors. Masks/facial coverings are not required for people who are outdoors if they are standing at least 10 feet apart from other people or engaged in strenuous physical activity outdoors, if social and physical distancing can be guaranteed. Miami-Dade County is issuing mask violation citations but there is currently a state order banning fines. Fines will be collected when state officials lift the current emergency order. There are currently no travel restrictions to the State of Florida.
